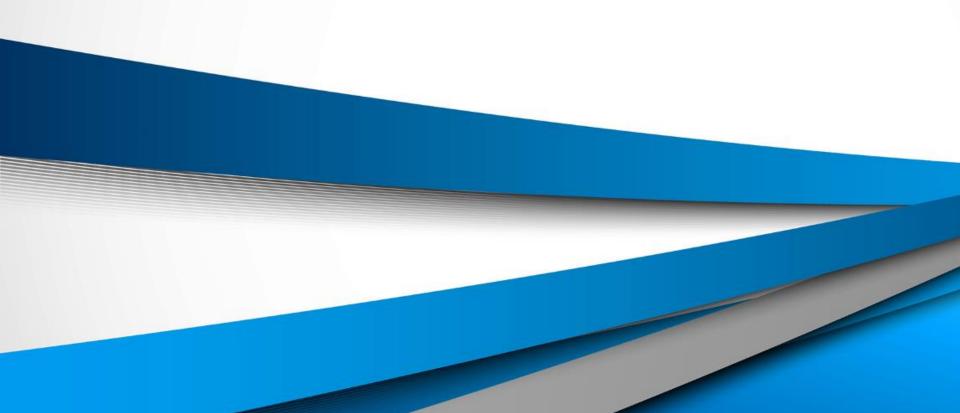

Truancy Prevention Specialist, Thompson School District




